The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA)

Overview:

- The ARRA of 2009 was signed into law by President Obama on February 17th, 2009
- An unprecedented effort to jumpstart our economy, create or save millions of jobs, and address long-neglected challenges

Recovery Act Purpose

- Preserve and create jobs and promote economic recovery
- Assist those most impacted by the recession
- Spur technological advances in science and health via investment
- Generate long-term economic benefits via investment
- Stabilize state and local government budgets

Principles

- As quickly as possible
- Prudent management
- Leveraging public and private funding



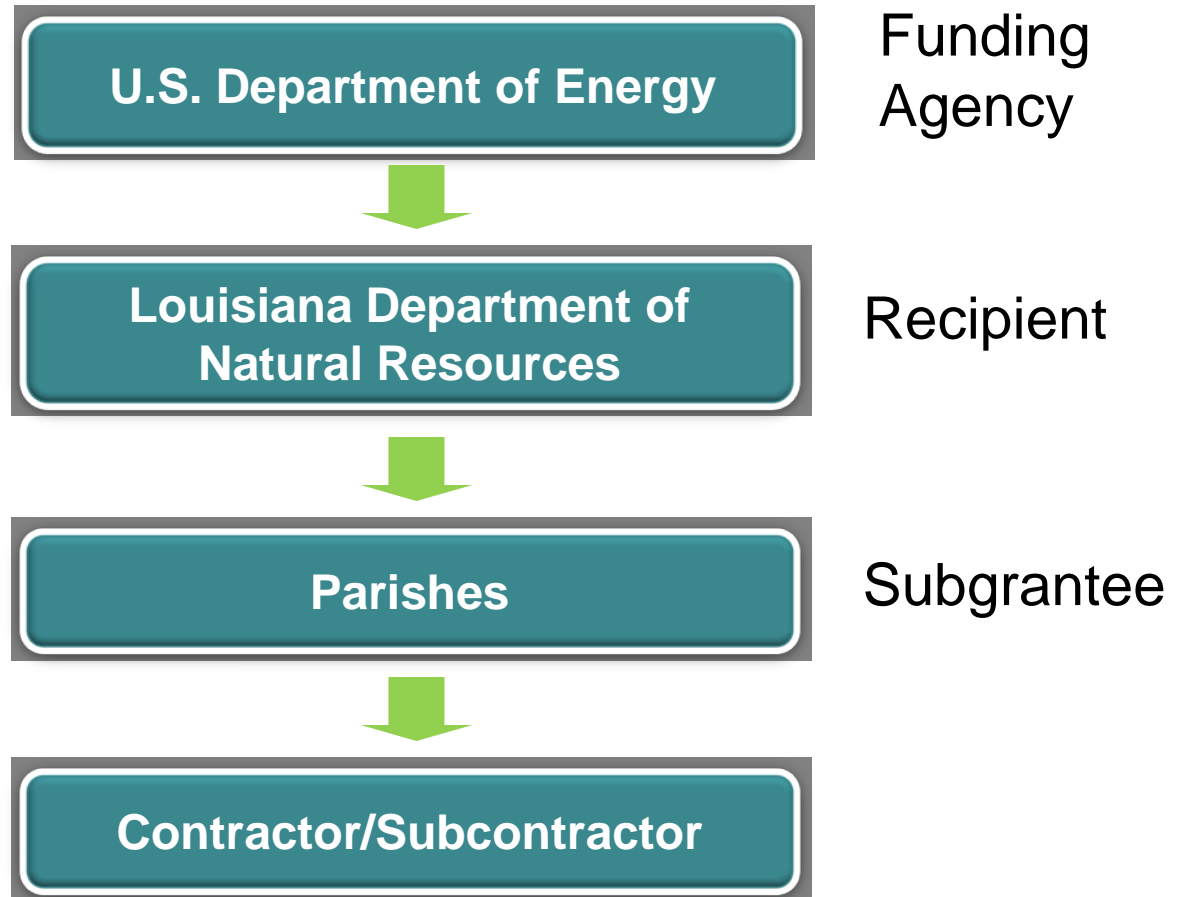
Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Program

- Administered by the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy (EERE)
- Under the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA), the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources received \$13.8 million in EECBG Funding.
- Renew Louisiana EECBG Program created to distribute funding to Parishes as equitably as possible.
- Funds awarded in May 2010.
- **Projects must begin immediately.**

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BUY AMERICAN PROVISION

Buy American Provision Overview

- The Buy American provision requires that **all the iron, steel, and manufactured goods** for projects funded by ARRA be produced in the United States.
- The Buy American provisions only apply to projects funded under the Recovery Act for the construction, alteration, maintenance or repair of a **public building or public works**.
 - Any project “owned” by a government entity is considered public work.
- Applies to the final product and not to the individual components.



Buy American Flow-down of Responsibilities

**Louisiana Department
of Natural Resources**



- Flow down the Buy American requirements to Subrecipients.
- Monitor Subrecipients for compliance with Buy American provision.

**Subgrantee:
Parishes**



- Flow down the Buy American requirements to contractors/subcontracts.
- Maintain documentation at a level they feel is appropriate to show compliance with the Buy American provisions.

**Contractor/
Subcontractor**

- Held responsible for complying with the Buy American provisions.

Buy American Exceptions

The ARRA provides three exceptions to the Buy American provision:

- 1. Non-availability:** item is not produced or manufactured in sufficient and reasonably available quantities of a satisfactory quality
- 2. Unreasonable cost:** inclusion of material will increase cost of the overall project by more than 25%
- 3. Inconsistency with public interest**

Buy American Nationwide Categorical Waivers

February 11, 2010:

1. Fluorescent electronic lighting ballasts;
2. LED traffic lights and crosswalk signals;
3. Screw-base and pin-base compact fluorescent lamps (with the exception of plug-in CFLs longer than 10 inches).

May 24, 2010:

1. Nonresidential programmable thermostats
2. Commercial scale fully automatic wood pellet boiler systems
3. Small district wood pellet and chip boiler furnaces
4. Variable refrigerant flow zoning and inverter driven ductless minisplit HVAC systems
5. Electrical “smart” strips/surge protectors
6. Gas or propane tankless water heaters up to 200,000 BTUs
7. Fully enclosed continuous composting systems

Buy American Required Documentation

- No specific requirement.
- Documentation could include, but is not limited to:
 1. Language in contractual documents that obligates contractors/subcontractors to comply Buy American;
 2. Receipts for the domestically-produced items;
 3. Documented certification from the contractor, vendor, distributor, supplier, or manufacturer;
 4. Detailed information supporting the claim;
 5. Other.



Buy American – Fraud Alert

- DOE has received complaints that foreign competitors are fraudulently marketing their products as compliant.
- Allegations of fraudulent claims in the high-efficiency lighting sector, particularly induction and LED products.
- Several websites promoting their products' compliance on the basis of being manufactured in a "Trade Agreement" country.
- An effort by the National Electrical Manufacturers Association ("NEMA") is underway to identify domestic induction and LED lighting manufacturers. This information will be available within the next two weeks.

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DAVIS BACON ACT

Davis-Bacon Act (DBA) Overview

- Requires payment of locally prevailing wages, including fringe benefits, to **laborers and mechanics** on federal government contracts in excess of \$2,000 for **construction, alteration, or repair** (including painting and decorating) of public buildings or public works who are employed directly on the site of the work.
- Section 1606 of the ARRA requires that all “projects funded **directly by or assisted in whole or in part** by the Federal Government...” comply with DBA requirements.



Davis-Bacon Act (DBA) Requirements

1. Contractors/subcontractors pay laborers and mechanics prevailing wages and fringe benefits;
2. Contractors/subcontractors pay laborers and mechanics on a weekly basis;
3. Requires that certified payrolls (Form WH-347) be submitted weekly;
4. Requires that employment records be kept for a period of 3 years after project completion;
5. Requires employers post the WH-1321 “Employee Rights under the Davis-Bacon Act” poster at the site of the work along with U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) wage determinations for each position..



How does DBA apply to your projects?

- Projects funded in whole or in part by ARRA funds are subject to DBA requirements, regardless of whether the work is performed on a public or private facility.
- Applies only to construction, alteration or repair work.
- Applies to work conducted on the project site.
- Does not apply to work performed by government employees.
- Does not apply for routine maintenance and incidental installation of equipment.
 - *Will be evaluated by U.S. DOE on a case-by-case basis.*



Davis-Bacon Act (DBA) Flow-Down of Responsibilities

Louisiana Department of Natural Resources



- Ensure applicable wage determinations are included in solicitations and resulting contracts and grants.
- Maintain original weekly certified payroll forms (WH-347) for U.S. Department of Energy (DOE).
- Conduct compliance audits.
- Conduct employee interviews.
- Report semi-annually to DOE.

Subgrantee: Parishes



- Receive original weekly certified payrolls (WH-347), review & submit to DNR.
- Identify wage determinations and ensure they are included in solicitations, procurement documents and contract awards.
- Ensure laborers and mechanics are paid weekly.
- Acknowledge receipt of labor clauses and DBA responsibilities (SF-1413) and submit to DNR.
- Conduct employee interviews.

Contractor/ Subcontractor

- Pay all laborers and mechanics weekly.
- Submit weekly certified payroll (WH-347) within 7 days of payment to Subgrantee.
- Post wage determinations and DBA poster on site of work.
- Acknowledge receipt of labor clauses and DBA responsibilities (SF-1413) and submit to Subgrantee.
- Maintain employee records during course of work & for 3 yrs after.

Davis Bacon Act (DBA) Clauses



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- Must be included in any labor RFP or contract documents

DAVIS BACON ACT (DBA) CLAUSES AS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR
(DOL)

Clause XIX. Davis Bacon Act and Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act.

Definitions: For purposes of this clause, Clause XIX, Davis Bacon Act and Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, the following definitions are applicable:

- (1) “Award” means any grant, cooperative agreement or technology investment agreement made with Recovery Act funds by the Department of Energy (DOE) to a Recipient. Such Award must require compliance with the labor standards clauses and wage rate requirements of the Davis-Bacon Act (DBA) for work performed by all laborers and mechanics employed by Recipients (other than a unit of State or local government whose own employees perform the construction) Subrecipients, Contractors, and subcontractors.



5. SF-1413 Statement and Acknowledgment

- Subgrantees must sign this form and return to DNR by **July 9th 2010**.
- Subgrantees must include “Standard Davis-Bacon Act and Labor Clauses” with their RFPs
- Additionally, Subgrantees must ensure that all contractors and subcontractors sign this form within ten (10) days from award.
 - Subgrantees must submit signed SF-1413 to DNR and keep a copy for their records.

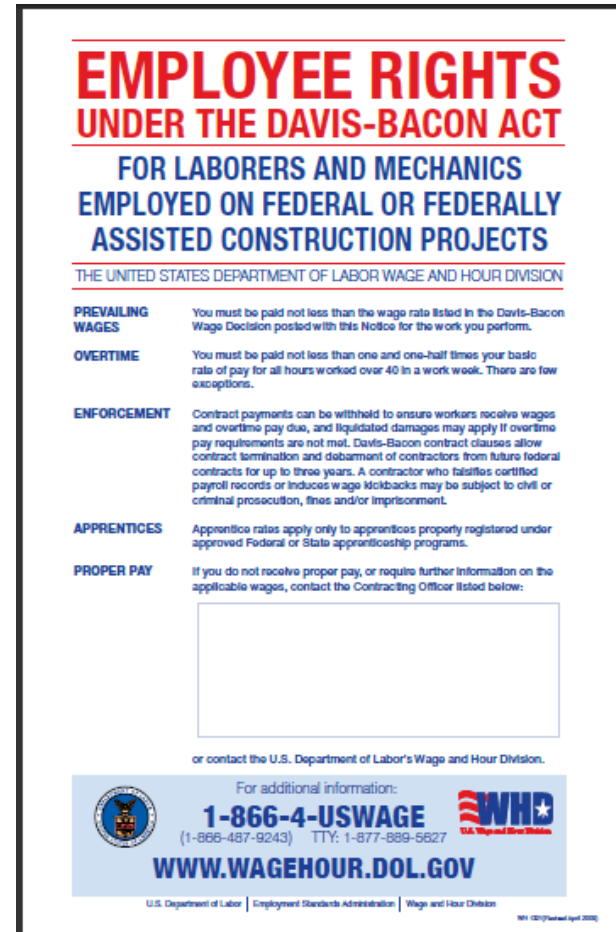

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PROCUREMENT

Procurement Process Overview

- ARRA Section 1554 encourages Subgrantees to award contracts funded in whole or in part with ARRA funds as fixed-price contracts through the use of competitive procedures.
- Non-competitive procedures are not encouraged.
- Subgrantees must follow existing state procedures when making a non-competitive procurement
 - Subgrantee must fully justify this action



Issuing Request for Proposals (RFPs)

- Information to include in RFPs and contract documents:
 - Davis Bacon Act – include “Standard DBA and Labor Clauses” and SF-1413
 - Buy American
 - Reporting
- Remember Subgrantees are required to pass down ARRA requirements to contractors/subcontractors

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REPORTING

Reporting

- All ARRA recipients must report on the use of EECBG funds for purposes of transparency and oversight.
- Subgrantees will be required to report on:
 - Progress of project
 - Completion of milestones and other significant results
 - Actual or anticipated problems delaying implementation
 - Hours worked on project
 - ARRA-funded hours
 - Non-ARRA funded hours
 - Energy saved
 - Equipment installed



Reporting

- Reports will be submitted by the Subgrantee via an online reporting program –
 - Reporting tool will be made available for August reporting.
 - An additional webinar will be held to train Subgrantees on use of reporting program.
 - Interim reporting form as excel document.



Reporting

- Submit monthly and quarterly progress reports by the 2nd day of the month.
- Failure to submit reporting in a timely manner is in violation of the MOA.
- Reimbursement requests for projects will not be processed until all required reporting information is received.

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REIMBURSEMENT REQUESTS

Reimbursement Requests - Overview

- Subgrantees will be reimbursed for all allowable expenses incurred in performing their Scope of Work
- Amount not to exceed the EECBG funding awarded
- A maximum of 90% of the total award amount will be available for progress payments prior to the completion of the project.
- 10% of the total award amount will be held back until project completion.
- A maximum of 5% of the total award amount can be used for administrative expenses.



Reimbursement Requests - Overview

- Submit to on a monthly basis on the last Friday of every month
- Submit original invoices
- Copies of all appropriate documentation of allowable expenses incurred

Reimbursement Requests - Overview

- Reimbursement requests will be reviewed for accuracy, validity and completion. Review criteria will include checking for:
 - Signature of authorized official
 - Quality of supporting documentation
 - Reconciliation with scope of work budget
 - Compliance with DBA and weekly payroll certification
 - Sufficient documentation for Buy American provision
 - Active status on Central Contractor Registry (CCR)
